IQC management is a participatory, step-by-step process to help improve Integrity, manage Quality, and ensure Compliance of small-scale WASH and WRM projects.

Too many WASH and WRM projects fail prematurely or are left unused because they are poorly planned, don't adequately meet user needs, or are weakened by corruption and integrity issues.

All in all, this means too many people who should benefit from water projects end up without the water, the capacities, or the resources they need. This must stop. Lives are at stake, as is the credibility of your organization.

IQC management is a voluntary methodology to introduce project management practices related to Integrity management, Quality control, and Compliance within your projects. It aims to:

- ✓ enhance effectiveness and impact of WASH and WRM projects,
- ✓ ensure interventions fulfil user needs,
- ✓ improve working relationships with project stakeholders,
- ✓ strengthen integrity within your projects, and
- ✓ establish a reputation as a more reliable organizations for partners and donors

Join this 1 ½ -day course. Learn how to apply IQC Management in your projects, with your constituencies and how to use IQC to extend your project portfolio.
